


Comments:

The Fourth Antiphone for Psalms at First and second Vespers and Laudes on the Feast of S. Andreas (c.f. Breviarium Romanum 1570.pag. 651, 655).

Transcribed from the print "Antiphonarium Vespertinum Dierum Festorum Totius Anni..." bd.2. 1597.

The print in three books containing settings of the antiphones was printed at the printing pres of the Canoni Regolari Sancti Spiritus prope Venetias of Which Girolamo Lambardi was a prominent member (He was the general of the order at least in 1605).

The antiphones in this collection are generally set with a gregorian chant melody as cantus prius factus in the bassus part.

Below a version of the chant close to the one used by Lanbardi as CPF.
