

Cantus

2. The Lord ye know is God indeed, Without our aid he did us make; We are his flock, he doth us feed, And for his sheep he doth us take.

Medius

3. O enter then his gates with praise, Approach with joy his courts unto: Praise, laud, and bless his name always, For it is seemly so to do.
4. For why? the Lord our God is good, His mercy is for ever sure; His truth at all times firmly stood, And shall from age to age endure.
